

2026 RULEBOOK REFUND POLICY

Changes from last season are made in **BLUE**.

Revisions during the season are made in **RED**.

PROS: If your bike is broken, and you have made NO time runs or qualifying runs in your class and you have a clean tech sticker for that class, you will receive a refund for the full value of your tech card for that class. If your bike is broken, and you have made ONE attempt to stage your bike in qualifying, then there is no refund.

GRUDGE: If your bike is broken, and you have made NO time runs or qualifying runs in your class and you have a clean tech sticker for that class, you will receive a refund for the full value of your tech card for that class. If your bike is broken, and you have made ONE attempt to stage your bike in a Grudge Session, then there is no refund.

BULLS: There are no refunds on Lock-In money whether you have made a run or not. Entry fee money follows the bike, not the rider. Riders may be substituted or swapped at any time during shakedown up until eliminations begin. We will be allowing racers to "transfer their entry fee money" to another bike if your bike is broken. You can sell your spot and transfer it to another bike all the way up until the first round.

SPORTSMAN: If your bike is broke, and you have made NO time runs or qualifying runs in your class and you have a clean tech sticker for that class, you will receive a refund for the full value of your tech card for that class. If your bike is broken, and you made ONE time run or qualifying run in your class and your tech sticker has a run mark for that run, you will receive a refund for the full value of your tech card minus \$20.

FRIDAY TESTING: If your bike is broke, and you have made NO test runs and you have a clean tech sticker for testing, you will receive a refund for the full value of your tech card. If your bike is broken, and you have made ONE attempt to stage your bike in testing, then there is no refund.

FRIDAY GAMBLER'S RACE: There are no refunds in the Gambler's Race because the purse is based on the number of bikes in the class. However, you may sell your entry to another racer before the first round of eliminations begin. In order to sell your entry to another racer, you and the racer that is buying your entry must come to the tower together before the first round begins and notify the race director so they can change the rider's information and bike number.
